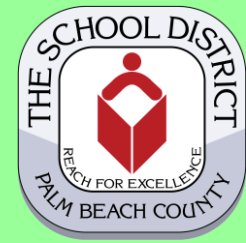

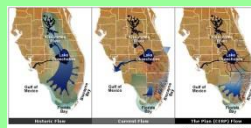
WHAT:
